## INTRODUCTION

Malaria is a life-threatening disease caused by parasites that are transmitted to people through the bites of infected female Anopheles mosquitoes. The good news is malaria is preventable and curable.

When an infected mosquito bites a human, it can introduce the parasite from its saliva into the person's bloodstream. Malaria is widespread throughout tropical and subtropical regions of the world, and Africa carries a disproportionately high share of the global malaria burden, both in terms of total malaria cases and malaria deaths.

In 2021, an estimated 247 million cases of malaria occurred worldwide. Most malaria cases in 2021 were in the World Health Organization (WHO) African Region accounting for 95% of the malaria cases equating to 96% of the deaths Worldwide. In 2021, there were an estimated 619,000 deaths from malaria globally. Children aged under 5 years are the most vulnerable group affected by malaria. In 2018, children under the age of 5 accounted for 80% of all malaria deaths in the African Region. Despite the outstanding efforts of WHO, we believe these numbers are under reported due to factors beyond WHO's control. Many deaths in the rural villages go unreported or under reported and therefore are not counted among the statistics.

Healing Faith Uganda continues to work in the Mayuge District where the malaria burden continues to be high due to the proximity to Lake Victoria.

In January of 2022, Healing Faith began construction of Malaria Center 2 located in Jinja District. Through collaboration with the local government, Healing Faith was able to sign an MOU with the Jinja Health District and receive licensure for the new Center. The new Center opened its doors in August of 2022 and began seeing patients in record number.

As with previous years, education continues to be the focal point of the Healing Faith Uganda model. The goal is to ensure that each patient and household that comes to the Malaria Center receives education regarding the signs, symptoms, prevention strategies and medication regimen regarding malaria.



Healing Faith has been able to provide stable, full-time employment, including health benefits to 36 Ugandan Nationals in 2022. In 2023 we expect the number of Ugandan National employment to increase.

The following report gives an overview of the programs and achievements over the course of the year for Healing Faith Uganda.

## THE MALARIA CENTERS

2022 was banner year for Healing Faith as an Organization. Malaria Center 2 was constructed and opened in August with the King of the Busoga Region presiding over the Ceremony. Malaria Center 2 saw double the amount projected patients in 2022. Overall, the organization saw over fifty-six thousand (56,000) patients at the two Malaria Centers combined. This is over double the patients seen in 2021. Several factors contributed to this increase. One, the rainy season in Uganda has been extended and unpredictable. This has led to a prolonged and fertile breeding season for the mosquitoes. This provides ideal conditions for the mosquito population to thrive, which in turn led to more cases of malaria. The second factor is the opening of Malaria Center 2. Malaria Center 2 was strategically built in a high malaria burden area. After a feasibility study, collecting data regarding malaria cases and number of malaria related deaths in Kibibi parish, the site was selected. Both Malaria Centers are known locally as a place that always has staff present and always has testing and treatment supplies in stock. The sphere of influence of the Malaria Centers has increased exponentially and people are traveling from further and further distances to reach the Centers. Word of mouth has led to the exponential growth of both Malaria Center 1 and will continue to grow the sphere of influence for Malaria Center 2.

In addition to medical needs of the patient there are staff members on hand to meet the educational needs of both the patient and the family members that brought the patient into the Malaria Center. In addition to the medical needs of the patients, education remains a focal point for each patient. In addition, the support staff on duty help to maintain smooth daily operations.

## PREGNANT PATIENTS

A major at-risk population for malaria is pregnant mothers. Mothers experiencing malaria during pregnancy are at risk for preterm labor, low birth weight or in the worst-case scenario, death of the fetus and even the mother. Due to the high number of expecting mothers attending both Malaria Centers, Healing Faith employees Midwife/Nurse at both Centers. Annette at Malaria Center 1 and Hope at Malaria Center 2. These ladies are not only able to treat the expecting mothers but is also able to educate them regarding the dangers of malaria during pregnancy and refer them for prenatal care.

## SEVERE PATIENTS

By having two (2) Licensed Laboratory Technicians on staff, the severity of the malaria case can be quantified and treated accordingly. If a patient is identified as Positive ++3 or ++4 for malaria, they are deemed *severe*. Throughout the course of the year almost three thousand severe cases of malaria were identified and treated.

When the patient is deemed too severe to be treated at the Malaria Centers or those requiring a blood transfusion they are labeled as a “referral case” and taken to Jinja. These patients are stabilized by the medical staff at the Malaria Centers, then transported by and attended to by Healing Faith medical team including a Nurse, Outreach Team Member and a Driver. Patients that needed overnight care or were deemed too severe to be treated at the Healing Faith Uganda Malaria Centers were taken to either Whisper’s Magical Children’s Hospital, Jinja Main Referral Hospital or, Nalufenya Children’s Hospital. Patients requiring blood are taken to the nearest facility with blood available. Patient care is then transferred to the receiving facility. In 2022 the Healing Faith Malaria Center saw sixteen (16) such referral cases. Many of those patients would have succumbed to the malaria had it not been for the early recognition, diagnosis, stabilization, and transport by the Healing Faith medical team.

The number of severe cases has increased due to having two licensed laboratory technicians on staff to provide better diagnostic care. The Lab Technicians are able to identify and quantify the parasite level, providing a better diagnosis and treatment plan for the patient. The higher number of referral cases seen at Malaria Center 2 can be attributed to several factors. One, patients are waiting an extended amount of time before coming to the Center for various reasons. This leads to more severe cases due to the extended amount of time that has passed allowing the parasite to multiply within the patient's bloodstream. Two, a sickle cell trait has been identified within the local community here which leads to a more severe case of malaria. Both issues are being combated by educating the local communities as to the dangers of waiting too long and allowing the malaria parasite to multiply. As the education continues and word of mouth regarding Malaria Center 2 spread, we hope to see these numbers decrease.



## MALARIA RELATED DEATHS - KIBIBI PARISH

Since August of 2021 healing faith has been tracking the malaria related deaths in Kibibi Parish. This consists of the seven villages surrounding the site for Malaria Center 2. The Healing Faith team has been working in conjunction with the VHTs and Local Leaders to collect this data each month. Since the opening of Malaria Center 2, there has been a 94.5% decrease in the malaria related deaths in Kibibi Parish. Healing Faith follows up on all the deaths in the Parish related to malaria each month to find the contributing factors to help improve our service delivery.

## 2022 IMPACT

2022 was another record setting year in terms of patients and overall growth of Healing Faith. The Malaria Centers combined tested fifty-two thousand six hundred and nine (52,609) patients for malaria with over seventy (70%) of those patients testing positive and receiving treatment. The team educated thirty-one thousand seven hundred eighty five (31,785) households. Thirty four thousand four hundred ninety eight (34,498) individuals above five (5) years of age were educated as to the signs, symptoms, treatment and prevention strategies for malaria. The Organization thrived in 2022 and continued to make a huge impact in the fight against malaria.

## HISTORICAL DATA

Since opening the Malaria Center doors in the summer of 2017 Healing Faith Uganda has tested over one hundred eight thousand (108,000) patients for malaria.

## THE STAFF

The 2022 Healing Faith is comprised of thirty (36) full time Ugandan Nationals. The number of staff positions was increased with the opening of Malaria Center 2, providing more job opportunities for Ugandan Nationals and the local community.

There were promotions this year from within the current National staff. Aguda Ambrose was promoted to the position of Supervisor to oversee operations at Malaria Center 2. Namuhejje Annette was promoted to Supervisor as well, to oversee operations at Malaria Center 1. Kamugish Julius remains in the position of Medical Manager and oversees all medical operations of the organization. Julius is currently enrolled in the final semester of classes to become a Medical Clinical Officer. Jason Segner remains the only foreign, non-Ugandan staff member based in Uganda, where he serves as the Director. His role remains as oversight of all Ugandan Programs, and he serves as a liaison between the US based parent organization.
